2011 COMMISSION CONFERENCE IN KATHMANDU, NEPAL

The Commission main event in 2011 will be hosted by Central Department of Geography at Tribhuvan University in Kathmandu, Nepal. Main organiser will be Steering Committee member Prof. Pushkar K. Pradhan. Main conference theme will be “**Geography of Governance - Dynamics for Local Development**”. We suppose that it is important to share the experiences of dynamics of local government and governance, to understand better existing opportunities and challenges, as well as prescriptions of public service delivery and their different impacts in different parts of the world. Planned conference subthemes will include – local government structure, process and functions; infrastructure, institutions, service delivery systems and management; challenges and measures in local development. Reflecting previous Commission conference in Kathmandu, we expect nice participation not only from Asia and Pacific regions, but from other parts of the globe as well. We suppose that this is the right place to put together experiences of more and less developed countries, experiences of countries after post-socialist transitions, as well as sharing of financial crisis measures adopted at the local level.

COMMISSION ACTIVITIES DURING IGU 2012 CONGRESS IN COLOGNE

The Commission already started to plan its activities during 32nd IGU 2012 Congress in Cologne (Köln, Germany). We would like to stay with our sessions within the main programme schedule and do not plan pre- or post-congress activities. The International Geographical Congress (IGC) 2012 core motto is “**Down to Earth**” and is organised around four major thematic complexes:

1. Global Change and Globalisation,
2. Society-Environment,
3. Risks and Conflicts
4. Urbanisation and Demographic Change.

It also would like to focus scientific interest on core topics of humanity. As it was already expressed by the organisers, the congress will be down to earth. The intention is, first of all, to have a cost-effective congress in Cologne without expensive representation, congress in which challenging scientific exchange in a stimulating and friendly atmosphere can take place. IGC in Cologne is returning back from conference centres into the university. We highly support such approach and will try to maximise our participation and attract commission members to return back to IGU congress.

PUBLICATION UNDER PREPARATION

The Commission from time to time prepare special publication output. The latest one is planned for this year. Within this publication we combine contributions based on papers delivered on previous commission meetings and some additional contributions provided by Commission members.
